Found in the apse of Saint Nicholas National Shrine

On the Cover: The image of the Theotokos in the Shrine of Saint Nicholas is one in which the Virgin is shown with her arms raised at her side, a gesture of intercessory prayer (*orans*), with a medallion of the bust of the Christ Child before her. This iconographic type first appeared in the middle years of the 11th century and quickly became one of the most popular images of the Theotokos, especially adapted for the curved space of an apse.

Such an image of the Theotokos and Christ Child is the visual expression of the doctrine of the Incarnation: the divine, pre-ternal Logos, seen here as the Christ Child, encircled within His medallion of sacred light, is placed before the breast of His Mother, from whom He takes on human flesh. Among the Greek-speaking Orthodox, this type of image of the Virgin and Child is often referred to as the *Platytera ton Ouranon* (She Who is More Spacious than the Heavens), since the Virgin contained God the Son in her womb. This is the Greek inscription flanking the image in the apse of the Shrine.

The Theotokos' raised arms in intercessory prayer, with the extended folds of her *maphorion* spread out as a protective sign, has a long association with the church of the Virgin of *Blachernai* in Constantinople. It was in this church that the relic of the Virgin's mantle (*maphorion*) was kept and according to tradition, the *maphorion* was carried in procession around the walls of the city during the Avar siege of 626, and again by Saint

Photios the Patriarch during the attack of the Rus in 860. And now the image of the *Panagia* in the apse of the Shrine of Saint Nicholas is called upon to spread open her protective mantle and safeguard the city of New York, a city that had been so devastatingly attacked on the tragic day of 9/11.

Numerous architectural details and elements within the cityscape beneath the image of the Theotokos and Christ Child reinforce this site-specific and topographic connection between the visual prayer of the apse image and the city of New York: the architectural skyline of Manhattan, and especially those new and surviving structures adjacent to Ground Zero, grouped together towards the lower left of the icon: the One World Trade Center Tower; the avian shaped World Trade Center Transportation Hub; the new Shrine of Saint Nicholas itself; the Liberty Park Sphere; the America's First Response Equestrian Monument; the Firehouse 10 at Liberty and Greenwich Streets; and the Essex World Cafe, owned by the Costalas family, that served as a trauma and triage center in the days following the horrific attacks on the World Trade Center.

With the Mother of God's arms extended in intercessory prayer and her mantle spread out over the city of New York, we are reminded how she embraces us and prays on behalf of the city, of all who come as worshippers and pilgrims to the Shrine, and also for those who lost their lives at Ground Zero on the horrific day of 9/11.

This past year is noteworthy for four major initiatives of the Order of St. the Order of St. Andrew the Apostle and other significant developments:

1. **Completing our first in-person religious freedom mission since 2019**

The Order's Leadership traveled to Bucharest, Romania, Sofia, Bulgaria and Athens, Greece June 8 – 19, 2022 where we promoted the religious freedom of the Holy Mother Church to the highest ecclesiastical and civil authorities. During our mission we joined Hon. George J. Tsunis, US Ambassador to the Hellenic Republic and esteemed Archon in honoring His All-Holiness Ecumenical Patriarch Bartholomew at the Embassy Residence and at the Niarchos Foundation Cultural Center and began a dialogue with the Archon Pammakaristos Leadership in Greece and Europe, Archons Athanasios Martinos, President and Gerasimos Fokas, Vice President to expand the Ecumenical Patriarch Bartholomew Foundation and plan the next Archon International Religious Freedom Conference tentatively scheduled for 2023 in Athens.



GREECE: The National Commander and National Vice Commander had the opportunity to meet with His All-Holiness and brief him on the religious freedom mission.



ROMANIA: The Archon delegation traveled to the Romanian Patriarchate, above, and was received by His Grace Bishop Varlaam, assistant bishop to the Patriarch and Secretary of the Holy Synod of the Romanian Orthodox Church. Later, they met with government officials, Mircea Abrudean, Head of the Chancellery of the Prime Minister, and Irina-Dumitrita Solomon, State Minister, at the Romanian Parliament, left. 2. Launching the Archon Sprout Youth Initiative

In an effort to promote the historical, canonical and ecclesiastical importance of the Ecumenical Patriarchate to our youth, the National Council established the Archon Sprout Youth Program under the leadership of the Regional Commanders of Pittsburgh Archons Nicholas J. Tranto and Nicholas Terezis. Archon Tranto (Chair) conceived of this brilliant initiative which was first developed in Pittsburgh, while the Regional Commanders of Chicago Archons John Manos and Gus Pablecas concurrently undertook similar programming with the Chicago Metropolis Youth. This significant initiative is now going nationwide, with Regional Commanders Archon Hon. Steven D. Counelis and Dr. Gregory G. Papadeas making presentations to the 585 attendees of the Metropolis of San Francisco YAL Conference this past Labor Day Weekend. In addition, Catherine J. Tsatalis, BA, MA (my beloved sister) a public school teacher for over 30 years is working with the Archon Sprout Youth Committee to prepare a catechism school curriculum on the Ecumenical Patriarchate which will be age and grade-specific from pre-K to 12th grades in cooperation with the GOA Department of Religious Education and its Director, His Grace Bishop Athenagoras of Nazianzos.



3. Establishment of the Order of St. Andrew Engagement Committees

The National Council, under the leadership of Archons Stephen A. Georgeson (Chair), Dr. Nicholas Loutsion, Gus Pablecas and John Manos responded to my request to develop topic-specific engagement committees to provide an instrument for Archons to pursue their individual interests in the various rubrics and contexts of religious freedom for the Ecumenical Patriarchate. To this end, 10 engagement committees were established from the State and Federal Governmental Affairs Committee to the Patriarchal Properties and Legal Issues Committee. I appointed at least one Chair and Vice Chair to each committee and any Archon who volunteered for a committee was automatically placed on the committee. The Committees are currently developing their programming...Stay tuned!

4. Launching the Archon Strategic Branding Initiative

Newly elected to the National Council Archon John G. Gumas, has offered to develop an Archon Strategic Branding initiative. Archon John is recognized as one of the country's foremost authorities on Challenger Brand Marketing®. He is the author of the popular books "Marketing Smart" and "Challenger Brand Marketing." In addition, Archon John is an adjunct professor of branding, advertising and interactive marketing, a sought-after speaker and a regular columnist for several publications and blogs and is the President of Gumas Advertising. I would like to publicly acknowledge and thank Archon George Marcus who recommended Archon Gumas to serve on the National Council... a brilliant suggestion Archon George!



In addition to the above four major initiatives of the Order of Saint Andrew that were launched in 2022, the following significant developments took place in 2022:

5. New officers elected to National Council

Archon Hon. B. Theodore Bozonelis was elected unanimously as **National Vice Commander**, and succeeding the late great Archon John Halecky, Jr. I lean on my brother Archon Judge Ted for his guidance and assistance in the daily operation of the Order and I am very grateful.



Archon Gus M. Pablecas was unanimously elected to succeed Archon Judge Ted as the **National Secretary** and brings a unique analytic mindset to his position as National Secretary and on the workings of the Order, as he is a former Special Agent of the FBI.

7. Ecumenical Patriarch Bartholomew Foundation continues to grow

The EPBF was established on January 17, 2019 as an independent, non-profit corporation under the laws of the State of New York and recognized as a 501c3 public charity by the IRS. The mission of the EPBF is to secure the economic foundation of the Ecumenical Patriarchate in **perpetuity**; and while doing so the Foundation honors the historic ministry of Ecumenical Patriarch Bartholomew, also in **perpetuity**. As of this writing, the Foundation has received pledges totaling \$20.990 million, including 187 FOUNDERS, who have committed to donating at


8. **31st Anniversary of the enthronement of His All-Holiness Ecumenical Patriarch Bartholomew the 269th direct successor of Saint Andrew the First Called Apostle.** The dynamic ministry of Martyria (witness) and Diakonia (service) of His All-Holiness is intrepid, sacrificial and inspiring. His decision to grant autocephaly to the Orthodox Church of Ukraine and speaking out against the aggression of Russia in their illegal war against the innocents of Ukraine are such examples of his unparalleled Patriarchal ministry that has spanned 31 years (enthronement November 2, 1991), despite being situated in a country noted for its profound religious freedom deficit and the number of journalists it has imprisoned (the most in the world). **Εις πολλά έτη Δέσποτα.**

The Order of St. Andrew, Archons of the Ecumenical Patriarchate in America from 2002 to 2022 has raised **\$58,442,892 which includes \$21,815,000 in Pledges from the Ecumenical Patriarchate in direct and indirect support of the sacred mission of the Ecumenical Patriarchate of Constantinople.**

The detailed report prepared by the Order's Assistant Treasurer, Archon Andreas D. Comodromos, CPA at the request of Commander Limberakis, indicates that \$36,627,892 was raised for the direct and indirect benefit of various initiatives supporting the Ecumenical Patriarchate which includes the full gamut of the Archons' domestic and international religious freedom programming (documentation available upon request). This \$36,627,892 (which including \$7,112,506 of donated services) coupled with the \$21,815,000 received in pledges by the Ecumenical Patriarch Bartholomew Foundation, another initiative of the Order of St. Andrew, amounts to \$58,442,892, a most significant statement reflective of the Order's ongoing diakonia to the Holy Mother Church. The Order is extremely proud of our Band of Archon Brothers, who serve as Stalwart Defenders of the Faith offering their Time, Talent and Treasure abundantly and generously for the well-being of the Holy and Great Mother Church of Constantinople.



ATHENAGORAS HUMAN RIGHTS AWARD

In 1986 the National Council of the Order of Saint Andrew, Archons of the Ecumenical Patriarchate in America established The Athenagoras Human Rights Award. The Award is presented every year at the Annual Banquet of the Order to a person or organization, which has consistently exemplified by action, purpose and dedication, concern for the basic rights and religious freedom of all people. The Award was named after one of the Great Church Leaders of the 20th Century, the late Ecumenical Patriarch of Constantinople, Athenagoras I.








RELIGIOUS FREEDOM MISSION

From June 8–19, 2022, a delegation from the Order visited **Romania**, **Bulgaria** and **Greece** on a Religious Freedom Mission, during which the Archons and their associates met with some of the key religious and political leaders of the respective countries to discuss all-important issues of international religious freedom.

The delegation met with these religious and secular leaders in order to explain the mission of the Archons, underscoring Orthodoxy's ethnic richness and respect for local cultures, and above all its universal, transcendent appeal. The delegation also endeavored to foster stronger connections among Orthodox communities in U.S. and the Mother Church in Constantinople, as well as among Orthodox countries including Romania, Bulgaria, Greece, and Cyprus, based on strong shared commitment to Orthodox faith and traditions.

The visit to Romania and Bulgaria was coordinated by Archon Dr. Nawaf Salameh of the Alexandrion Group in Romania, and Archon Boris and Youlianna Gurov in Bulgaria. The Alexandrion Foundation is a strong supporter of religious freedom and open dialogue among interfaith communities.

ROMANIA

RELIGIOUS FREEDOM MISSION

The Archons promoted religious freedom in a region where it is under intense attack in neighboring Ukraine. Romania is a strong supporter of the Ecumenical Patriarchate and its Patriarchate was one of the first to recognize the autocephaly of the Church of Ukraine.



The Mission began in Romania. A delegation including Dr. Anthony J. Limberakis, National Commander of the Order; Judge B. Theodore Bozonelis, the Order's National Vice Commander; Father Alexander Karloutsos, Spiritual Advisor of the Order; Archon John Mindala; and Nicholas Kass arrived in Bucharest on Thursday, June 9, along with an accompanying delegation consisting of Dr. Maria A. Limberakis; and Mrs. Helen Bozonelis.

On Thursday, June 9, the delegation visited the Romanian Presidency in Bucharest and had a meeting with Mr. Sergiu Nistor, Presidential Adviser in the Department of Culture, Religion and National Minorities. Also on

Thursday, the delegation was invited to participate in celebrations marking Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II's Platinum Jubilee, hosted by the British Ambassador, Mr. Andrew Noble LVO, and Mrs. Helen Noble. This provided a good opportunity for the Archons and their associates to meet with Romanian representatives from politics, business environment, the press, and more.

On Friday, June 10, the Archon delegation visited the Alexandrion Group offices in Bucharest. They were welcomed by Archon Dr. Nawaf Salameh, who is the Chairman of the Alexandrion Group and a FOUNDER of the Ecumenical Patriarch Bartholomew Foundation.

ST. NICHOLAS OPENS

During the 9/11 terrorist attacks, the St. Nicholas Greek Orthodox Church was crushed by the falling south tower of the World Trade Center. Now, 21 years later, the church has reopened its doors. Its first parishioners celebrated the feast of Saint Nicholas on December 5-6, 2022.



Then and Now

On September 11, 2001, St. Nicholas Greek Orthodox Church, a neighborhood parish built in 1916, left, was destroyed. Today, it is reopen for worship and also serves as a shrine and memorial to those who perished on 9/11.



Father Loukas of Xenophontos, a monk from Mount Athos, painted the stunning murals inside the newly reopened structure.

Archons Michael Psaros and Dennis Mehiel, Chairman and Vice Chairman, said, " Saint Nicholas is standing tall, shining bright, and welcomes everyone to its awe inspiring Sanctuary. We are so much more than a flickering candle; we are burning strong and brilliant.

The glory of Orthodoxy fills the dome, the apse, the walls and the very air with the healing message of the Gospel. Our National Shrine bears witness – a vibrant and engaged witness – to the story of 9/11, the story of the Greek Orthodox People of America, and the greatest story ever told, the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ."

Made from Greek marble and decorated with ornaments iconog-

raphy, upwards of \$80 million was raised to complete the complicated structure, which glows at night. The Order of St. Andrew was one of the many organizations who made a significant contribution towards its rebuilding.

The shrine will be open to the public for tours daily and will be a fully functioning parish of the Greek Orthodox Archdiocese of America.

Genesis of a Resurrection

Santiago Calatrava was selected as the architect to rebuild St. Nicholas and detailed watercolor renderings, above, show inspiration drawn from within Hagia Sophia which lead to shape the current form of the new Shrine.



Ground Blessing, October 2014

The Ground Blessing Service was based on the service of Laying the Cornerstone for a Church. For Saint Nicholas National Shrine, cairns (a memorial collection of stones) were built up in imitation of the cairn at Gilgal that the Prophet Joshua fashioned to commemorate the crossing over of the Israelites into the Promised Land (Joshua, ch. 4). Two cairns, in remembrance of the Twin Towers, were blessed and symbolically built by Greek Orthodox Archdiocesan organizations and leaders. 
Andreas D. Comodromos, CPA, Assistant Treasurer

Counelis, Archon Nomophylax, participated in the annual Warsaw Human Dimension Conference of the Organization for Security and Co-operation in Europe (OSCE) in Warsaw, Poland, where they made poignant presentations promoting the religious freedom of the Holy Mother Church. The Archon two-man team met with delegations from the United States and other countries

and entities dedicated to human rights and fundamental freedoms worldwide.

The OSCE's annual Warsaw Human Dimension Conference is Europe's largest annual human rights and democracy conference. It is a platform for the 57 OSCE participating nation states, international organizations and other relevant actors to take stock of the implementation of the OSCE's human dimension commitments.

Since 2006, the Order has sent a delegation to the OSCE meet-

According to the 2022 Report, ‘the state of religious freedom in Turkey remained deeply troubling, with the perpetuation of restrictive and intrusive governmental policies on religious practice and a marked increase in incidents of vandalism and societal violence against religious minorities.’” –Archon Sisson

ings in order to present vital information to the international community on the Turkish Republic's continuing violations of human rights and religious freedom perpetrated against the Ecumenical Patriarchate.

Archons Sisson and Counelis each participated in the assembly and submitted written statements. On September 28, Archon Sisson presented an oral argument detailing the discrimination and impediments to religious freedom faced by the Ecumenical Patriarchate in Turkey today.

Many of the 57 participating nation states send ambassadors to the OSCE. Because of the conference's immense importance and prestige, the U.S. State Department sends a delegation to the meetings as well. Archons Sisson and Counelis conferred

with the United States representatives, including the United States Ambassador to the OSCE, Michael R. Carpenter, and head of the American delegation Ambassador Michael G. Kozak of the U.S. State Department. The Archons provided these officials with the most current information regarding the status of our Ecumenical Patriarchate in Turkey, and regarding the major issues, most recent developments and current documents of the Order.

Archons Counelis and Sisson also conferred with others in attendance who are sympathetic to the plight of the Ecumenical Patriarchate.

Anthony J. Limberakis, M.D., National Commander of the Order of Saint Andrew the Apostle, Archons of the Ecumenical Patriarchate, stated: "Since 2006

The Order has prioritized sending a delegation to the OSCE Human Dimension meetings so that the ongoing, egregious violations of fundamental religious freedom and institutional human rights are presented to the world community. Goncharenko made a presentation at a reception that included Civil Society members, as well as the U.S. delegation at the OSCE conference, including Dr. Michael Carpenter, above. During his presentation, Goncharenko displayed a Ukrainian flag that flew over Kyiv during the recent battles for the city. Bullet holes were clearly visible in the flag.

When he displayed that flag to those who were assembled at the U.S. Ambassador’s reception, all in attendance were visibly moved. With the blessings of His Eminence Archbishop Elpidophoros of America, the Rev. Dr. Nicholas G. Louh led the John Halecky, Jr. 18th Annual National Archon Lenten Retreat on April 8 and 9, 2022. The Retreat was held at the Dormition of the Virgin Mary Greek Orthodox Church of the Hamptons, hosted by Father Alexander Karloutsos, Archon Spiritual Advisor, and Father Constantine Lazarakis, who served as Retreat Pastors.

Fr. Nicholas addressed over one-hundred participants both in person and virtually. Focusing on renewal of one's faith, one's mind, and one's purpose, Fr. Nicholas discussed how true renewal can begin

in our lives, explaining five practical ways we can renew our faith today. Fr. Nicholas explained the meaning of repentance, and asked: "Who's sitting in God's throne in your life?" Fr. I called to do? Why am I here on earth?" Fr. Nicholas revealed what he referred to as God's dream for our lives, along with eight practical steps to work towards it.

Among the many ways in which the Order of Saint Andrew the Apostle, Archons of the Ecumenical Patriarchate, exercises its sacred mission of supporting and defending the Ecumenical Patriarchate is through ten Archon Engagement Committees.

These committees are made up of tireless, dedicated Archons who provide active and ongoing defense of the Ecumenical Patriarchate in an enormous range of fields, including political action, environmental advocacy, youth outreach, parish initiatives, and much more. Each Archon Engagement Committee is divided into several, subject matter specific subcommittees, and works to develop original initiatives for

consideration of inclusion in the national policy of the Order of St. Andrew.

The Archon Engagement Committees are an initiative that was organized by Archon Stephen A. Georgeson, Esq.

Dr. Anthony J. Limberakis, National Commander of the Order of Saint Andrew the Apostle, remarked: "The Archon Engagement Committees highlight the diverse and multifaceted ways in which the

Order fulfills its mission of defending and protecting our holy Mother Church of Constantinople. They demonstrate how the Archons are striving constantly to bring the light of our holy Orthodox Faith and our Ecumenical Patriarch into all aspects of life and society. Congratulations and thanks to Archon Stephen Georgeson for this magnificent initiative."



Academia Symposia Committee

This committee is charged with the responsibility of organizing and managing academia symposia focusing both on the external challenges facing the Ecumenical Patriarchate and on the five major religious freedom issues critical to the Ecumenical Patriarch and to Orthodox Christians.



Communications Committee

The mission of the committee is to develop communications strategies for the Order in its social media and website platforms and for creating guidance for individual Archons who are making parish and Metropolis educational presentations.

Ecumenical Patriarch Bartholomew Foundation

The mission of the Foundation is to provide financial independence for the Ecumenical Patriarchate in perpetuity. The Foundation is charged with the responsibility of developing strategy on membership recruitment and an internal communications platform for ongoing updates for prospective members. This includes print and electronic media reaching out to the broadest base of supporters among all ministries, organizations and the Faithful.



Federal and State Governmental Affairs Committee

This committee provides critical grassroots support at both the state and federal levels for Congressional and legislative initiatives on behalf of the Ecumenical Patriarchate.



Metropolis and Parish Education Committee

This committee is developing an overall educational strategy for individual parish and Metropolis communities, focusing on the role of our Ecumenical Patriarchate in world Orthodoxy in general and on American Orthodoxy in particular. Because so many people, especially the youth, have no idea who our Ecumenical Patriarch and our Ecumenical Patriarchate are, educating the Omogenia on this basic information should be paramount.



Patriarchal Properties and Legal Issues Committee

This committee is responsible for dealing specifically with issues concerning patriarchal properties and also more broadly with general patriarchal legal issues.



Editorial Publication Committee

This committee is responsible for drafting and submitting editorials for publication in all print and online media at any time it is determined necessary to communicate support or disagreement with, or to clarify, respond to or correct news articles or editorial opinions relating in any way with the Ecumenical Patriarchate and with related religious freedom issues.



International Archons Committee

The critical task of this committee is to help develop separate organizational structures for the Archons in Europe, South America, Asia, Africa and Australia and to assist in the creation of mission-oriented Orders. Because some of these areas have their own Archon organizations (i.e., Greece has Pammakaristos), the committee's task in these cases would be to coordinate working with these groups rather than organizing a new group of Archons.



Patriarchal Green Initiatives Committee

This committee works to disseminate information to Orthodox faithful and government decision makers on those Green Initiatives identified by His All-Holiness as most critical, as well as to highlight the various symposia and activities hosted by the Ecumenical Patriarch highlighting the endangered areas around the world (i.e., Antarctic, Amazon River, Mississippi River).



Youth Participation Activities Committee

The mission of this committee is to connect with the various youth committees and organizations in our communities, establish regular gatherings with them, help educate them on the religious freedom challenges facing the Ecumenical Patriarchate and instruct them on the various initiatives undertaken by the Order to successfully overcome these obstacles.

EDUCATING OUR FUTURE

Many events held throughout the year enabled Archons to engage and educate youth and young adults on the person of His All-Holiness, the institution of the Ecumenical Patriarchate and the work and mission of the Order.

Pilot Archon Sprout Program Provides Religious Education on Ecumenical Patriarchate in Dayton, Ohio

In consultation with Bishop Athenagoras of Nazianzos, Director of Religious Education for the Greek Orthodox Archdiocese of America, a key member of the Archon Youth Participation Activity Engagement Committee, Ms. Katina Tsatalis, long-time public school teacher and beloved sister of our National Commander, has developed an age-specific pilot program of Sunday School modules for Pre K–12 students at Annunciation Greek Orthodox Church in Dayton, Ohio. Archons Nicholas J. Tranto and Nicholas Terezis, chair and vice chair respectively of the Archon Youth Engagement Committee, deserve kudos for their great work! The objective is to teach our Greek Orthodox Christian children, at the earliest ages, the historical and religious significance of the Ecumenical Patriarchate, and to introduce them to the sacred global mission of His All-Holiness.



Archons Engage Young Adults at Metropolis of San Francisco YAL Conference

At the Metropolis of San Francisco Young Adult League (YAL) Conference in San Diego, California on September 3, 2022, Archon Regional Commanders Hon. Steven G. Counelis and Dr. Gregory G. Papadeas introduced the 585 attendees to the threats to international religious freedom, and to the major issues confronting the Ecumenical Patriarchate. Archon Counelis serves as Vice-Chair of the “Youth Participation Activities” Engagement Committee. Archon Papadeas serves on the same Committee, and is Regional Commander of the Metropolis of Denver. Archon Counelis, Regional Commander of the Metropolis of San Francisco, and his wife Stacia have served as the Conference Advisers to the YAL Conference Ministry of the Metropolis of San Francisco since its renaissance in 2018.



Archon Sprout Initiative continues at Camp Nazareth

On July 12, 2022, Regional Commanders Nick Tranto and Nick Terezis delivered a 40-minute multimedia presentation to nearly one-hundred campers, camp counselors and clergy attending Camp Nazareth in Mercer, PA, as part of the Archon Sprout Initiative.



Archons Continue Sprout Initiative at Chicago YAL Conference

The Archon Regional Commanders for the Metropolis of Chicago, Gus M. Pablecas, and John G. Manos, along with Archons Perry Siatis and Jeff Chrones, on February 18-20, 2022, represented the Order at the YAL Conference held in Chicago, Illinois at the Loews Chicago O'Hare Hotel. 750 registered YAL participants attended the Conference where Archons made a religious freedom presentation focused on creating awareness of the issues facing the Ecumenical Patriarchate, the threat to the Orthodox Faith and the role of the Archons in defending and promoting the Mother Church. In addition, the Archons established a vendors table for YAL participants to ask questions, obtain publications and to learn more about the Order of St. Andrew the Apostle throughout the weekend.



VANDALIZATIONS & DESECRATIONS

The Byzantine Gems of Hagia Sophia and the Sumela Monastery were shown signs of disrespect while the Ecumenical Patriarchate's historic Balikli Hospital suffered significant damage due to a tragic fire.

Hagia Sophia's 1,400-year-old Imperial Gate vandalized

One of Turkey's most significant historical artifacts, Hagia Sophia, has been vandalized.

The plight of the Hagia Sophia, which was converted to a mosque in July 2020, is back in the news with reports that the 1,400-year-old imperial gate of the edifice was vandalized. In April, the Turkish Union of Art History posted photos of the damage. The image of the vandalized oak door, warn observers, means that the international community's repeated urging that the iconic building be used as an "intercultural space" have fallen on deaf ears.



The Imperial Gate, also known as the Imperial Door, is one of the nine doors that opens to the main hall of the mosque. Used by emperors in the past, the door is specifically called the "Imperial Door."

Statement by Greek Foreign Ministry condemning the incident

Ecumenical Patriarch, Greece Protest to Turkey Over DJ Performance at Sumela Monastery

Turkey's authoritarian militarist regime has continued to violate international standards of religious freedom by desecrating the cultural heritage of the Ecumenical Patriarchate: Turkish authorities authorized the filming of a commercial with disco dancing at the Patriarchal Monastery of Panagia Sumela, part of the Ecumenical Patriarchate's historic patrimony that is under consideration by UNESCO as a World Heritage site.



Each year on August 15 the service for the Dormition of the Virgin Mary is celebrated by Ecumenical Patriarch Bartholomew at this location.

Tragic Fire Ravages Balikli Greek Hospital

At noon on August 4, 2022, the courageous remnant of Greek Orthodox Christians in Constantinople was deeply shaken by a tragic fire at the Balikli Greek Hospital and Home for the Aged in the Zeytinburnu district of the city. The fire caused im-

mense structural damage. However, the loss of life was prevented with the support of state and local institutions, surrounding hospitals, neighbors and the staff of the institution. The National Council of the Order of Saint Andrew the

Apostle, Archons of the Ecumenical Patriarchate, voted unanimously to approve a \$100,000 donation for the relief of those who have been displaced by this fire, and for the rebuilding of the structure.

USCIRF Again Recommends Turkey for Special Watch List In Light of Its Worsening Record on Religious Freedom



The U.S. Commission on International Religious Freedom (USCIRF) released its 2022 Annual Report, which again recommends that Turkey be included on the "U.S. Department of State's Special Watch List for engaging in or tolerating severe violations of religious freedom pursuant to the International Religious Freedom Act (IRFA)." USCIRF made this recommendation in light of the fact that, as its report notes, "in 2021, religious freedom conditions in Turkey remained poor, with no improvement from the previous year."

The 2022 report details the continued decline of religious freedom in Turkey over the last year, including the fact that it "took no steps to reopen the Theological School of Halki (Halki Seminary), preventing the Ecumenical Patriarchate

from training clergy for more than 50 years." USCIRF also pointed out that in Turkey, the Ecumenical Patriarchate and other minority religious communities face bureaucratic obstacles that prevented or seriously impeded their ability to practice their religion freely and fully.

The full Report contains numerous details about the continually deteriorating plight of Christians in Turkey. It states that "throughout the year, both religious and ethnic minorities faced governmental or societal targeting along religious lines," and that "the Turkish government also failed to protect other religious sites, including historical places of worship and cemeteries."

Turkey has been mistreating Christians and disregarding Turkey's rich Christian heritage for years.

USCIRF first added Turkey to its Watch List in 2009 as requiring "close monitoring due to the nature and extent of violations of religious freedom." In 2012, USCIRF recommended that Turkey be designated a "Country of Particular Concern" (CPC), that is, as one of the principal violators of religious freedom worldwide, a country in which such violations are "systematic, ongoing, and egregious."

In 2014, USCIRF returned Turkey to the Special Watch List, where it remained until 2021. In the new report, USCIRF recommends that the U.S. government return Turkey on Watch List for continuing to engage in severe violations of religious freedom pursuant to the International Religious Freedom Act (IRFA).

UKRAINE

A TRAGIC ONGOING WAR

On February 24, 2022, Russia invaded Ukraine. The invasion has resulted in tens of thousands of deaths on both sides. It has caused Europe's largest refugee crisis since World War II. The war was a major topic in the Archon arena and support and educational lectures helped our communities understand the tensions and role of the Moscow Patriarchate in the Russian Invasion.

Archons and Bouras Foundation offer \$100K in Ukraine Relief

The Order announced early in 2022, that it made a grant of \$50,000 for relief of the people of Ukraine. The grant was matched by the Nicholas J. and Anna K. Bouras Foundation, making for a total grant of \$100,000. Archbishop Elpidophoros stated: “The Order of Saint Andrew the Apostle’s and Nicholas J. and Anna K. Bouras Foundation’s extraordinarily generous gifts to the Ukrainian people and all who find themselves in the dire circumstances of this terrible and unjust war is a tangible fulfillment of our Lord Jesus’ command to ‘give, and it will be given to you; good measure, pressed down, shaken together, running over, will be put into your lap. For the measure you give will be the measure you get back’ (Luke 6:38). The Archons and the Nicholas J. and Anna K. Bouras Foundation have given, and they will surely be rewarded richly by the Lord and His All-Holy Mother for their self-sacrifice.”

Understanding the Role of the Moscow Patriarchate in the Russian Invasion of Ukraine

On April 4, 2022, Archangel Michael Greek Orthodox Church in Port Washington, New York presented an event that illuminated the role of the Moscow Patriarchate in Russia's invasion of Ukraine.

Archon George Demacopoulos interviewed Sergei Chapnin, a former Moscow Patriarchate insider, who offers a candid assessment of the inner workings of the Moscow Patriarchate and its role in the invasion of Ukraine. The two discussed crucial questions that have had a direct bearing on recent headlines, including: What is the relationship between the Moscow Patriarchate and Putin's government? How has the Patriarch's development of the Russki Mir (Russian World) ideology fueled the Kremlin's imperialist aspirations? On what basis does the Moscow Patriarch claim to be protecting "Traditional Values" against a "godless West"? And are there alternative voices within the Russian Church?

The discussion also included a pastoral reflection by Archbishop Elpidophoros. His Eminence's remarks went beyond the prevailing superficial analyses of the Russia-Ukraine conflict to provide a deeply spiritual and thought-provoking view of war in Ukraine and war in general.



The Order Decries Russian Persecution of Ukrainian Orthodox Priests

In an explosive piece published on August 13, 2022, the *Wall Street Journal* reported that "in Russian-occupied parts of Ukraine, clergy members are targets" of invading Russian forces. The Journal added that "dozens of priests from the Orthodox Church of Ukraine, the country's largest denomination, have been kidnapped or killed since the invasion began, according to church officials."

The Order deplored this targeted persecution and harassment of Ukrainian Orthodox clergy, and called upon Moscow Patriarch Kirill and the entire Russian Orthodox Church, in the name of our common Orthodox faith, to condemn these practices and work to bring about their immediate end.



Washington Post Cites Order of Saint Andrew's Analysis of Moscow Patriarchate's Efforts to Divide Orthodox Faithful

On May 5, 2022, the *Washington Post* published a thoughtful analysis by David Ignatius of how Russia's invasion of Ukraine is inextricably linked to the Moscow Patriarchate's years-long efforts to supplant the Ecumenical Patriarchate and become the global leader of the Orthodox faithful. Ignatius quotes from an essay collection, "The Ecumenical Patriarchate and Ukrainian Autocephaly," edited by Archon Evagelos Sotiropoulos and published by the Order of Saint Andrew the Apostle in 2019. The Post article also provides observations on Russia's efforts against the unity and order of the Church from Archon National Commander Dr. Anthony J. Limberakis and the Order's Spiritual Advisor, Father Alexander Karloutsos.

His All-Holiness meets with President Duda, and Ukrainian Refugees in Poland

His All-Holiness visited Poland at the invitation of the President of Poland, Andrzej Duda, who officially invited the Ecumenical Patriarch to visit and offer words of support, consolation and hope to the millions of refugees that have fled from Ukraine as a result of the ongoing invasion by Russia.

President Duda expressed his profound gratitude to His All-Holiness for accepting his personal invitation, adding that "today His All-Holiness, as a tireless pilgrim, has come to bless the refugees from Ukraine." The President also acknowledged and thanked the Ecumenical Patriarch for his clear and consistent support of the victims of this horrendous war.

His All-Holiness also met with ecumenical leaders, led by the President of the Polish Conference of Roman Catholic Bishops, His Excellency Archbishop Stanislaw Gądecki, repeating his condemnation of the Russian invasion of Ukraine as "unjust and unjustifiable."

Moreover, His All-Holiness was warmly received by His Beatitude Metropolitan Sawa of Warsaw and All Poland, who hosted the Patriarchal delegation for a prayer service in the Cathedral of Hagia Sophia where the Ecumenical Patriarch had laid the foundation stone in 2015. There, His All-Holiness denounced the slaughter of Ukrainian Orthodox by Russian Orthodox as "absolutely unacceptable."

During his time in Warsaw, the Ecumenical Patriarch was able to visit several migrant shelters, where he had the opportunity to meet personally with Ukrainian refugees in order to hear their painful stories and convey his paternal support, as well as to distribute icons and gifts to the many children who left behind their fathers, homes and schools in Ukraine.

Finally, His All-Holiness held a number of press conferences about the purpose of his visit, the horror of the current war, and the plight of the refugees from Ukraine.





The First Lady of Ukraine at the Ecumenical Patriarchate

On October 2, 2022 His All-Holiness Ecumenical Patriarch Bartholomew received Her Excellency Mrs. Elena Zelenskaya, the wife of His Excellency the President of Ukraine, Mr. Volodymyr Zelensky. She was accompanied by Mr. Andriy Yermak, Head of the Office of the President; Ms. Yulia Svyrydenko, First Deputy Prime Minister of Ukraine; Mr. Andrii Sybiha, Deputy Head of the Office of the President of Ukraine; Mr. Vasyl Bodnar, the Ambassador of Ukraine in Ankara; Mr. Roman Nedilskyi, the Consul General in Constantinople; officials of the Presidency, and associates.

During the meeting, His All-Holiness once again expressed the support of the Ecumenical Patriarchate for the Ukrainian people, who have been severely tested by the war, and who with vigor and determination are defending the territorial integrity of their homeland, and expressed the hope that the war would soon end and that peace would be restored to Ukraine.

Her Excellency thanked His All-Holiness for his concern and support for the people of Ukraine.
